
The Pastor's Pen Why should I be part of the Small Group Campaign?

O, let me count the ways!



Q: Why are we having the church-wide small group campaign now?

A: Our leadership believes it is time to revitalize the church's mission, which is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We will be working through in a small group context what it means to be a church that focuses on this "main thing" of making disciples. Much of discipleship takes place in close personal relationships with other Christians. A small group setting is an ideal place to grow those relationships. Each small-group in the campaign will take time to build relationships and will study common resources to help us get on the same page in understanding what healthy, vibrant Christian discipleship in the Wesleyan tradition looks like.

Q: What is a 'disciple' of Jesus?

A: A disciple is one who puts Jesus' teaching into practice. What does that look like in our context? We will be figuring that out together in this campaign.

Q: Why are small groups part of discipleship?

A: Simply put, it is part of the model for discipleship Jesus gave us. He ran such a group with his 12 disciples, investing his time & energy in their lives, loving them and teaching them his ways in a small group setting. Being in a small group today can help you grow as Jesus' disciple. Small groups can offer support, friendship, and encouragement for faith.

Q: Why should I be part of a small group in our church?

A: We have approximately 515 professing members, plus the children's baptismal roll. We see about half of all members on a regular basis. In a large church such as ours, many folks fall through the cracks if they are not connected in personal relationships with other members outside Sunday worship. There are too many people for the pastors to shepherd each one effectively. Members' personal lives and spiritual walk may go

unsupported because there is no time at Sunday morning worship to get into very deep personal relationships with others. People may begin to feel lonely and disconnected, even while sitting in a large crowd of fellow worshippers. Also, missing members may not be noticed as absent on Sunday morning, because friends may suppose they are at a different service.

These things have been happening at our church. To remedy this, we must realize that each member needs to be and feel connected to the Body of Christ beyond Sunday worship to grow as a disciple. Small groups are an ideal way to meet these needs. Small groups give the members of the Body of Christ a personal and a spiritual connection to each other in a setting where each member can know and be known, love and be loved by the others. They can pray for each other, bear each other's burdens and encourage each other along the way. Small groups provide a way for disciples to help each other walk the walk of faith all through the week. The campaign is a way to kickstart this process.

Q: Why do I need to be part of the campaign to join the strategic planning work in 2019?

A: The Administrative Board has realized that to revitalize our mission, we must develop a new strategic process of discipleship at First UMC. The Board approved the small group campaign to help train both themselves and others to effectively do this planning work. Each Board member is committing to participate in the campaign. They want as much participation as possible from the congregation to create the new strategic plan. Therefore, they are asking others who want to help create the Strategic Plan to prepare themselves the same way by also being part of the campaign. The goal is that we be unified in understanding and Spirit when we get together in the new year to do the planning work.

Q: When is the Strategic Planning work scheduled?

A: In January-February 2019, all those trained in the campaign will come together for ~6 to 8 sessions to design the new Long-Term Strategic Plan, which is centered on a Master Plan of Discipleship.

Q: What does the campaign have to do with what is happening in the United Methodist Church?

The campaign will also help us prepare for whatever decisions are made by the special 2019 Session of General Conference.

Small Group Campaign FAQ

Q: What will happen during a typical small group session this fall?

A: Each group session will involve study of some easy-to-read materials, a video component corresponding to the week's theme, discussion of key questions, and some relationship building activities and prayer. Sessions will typically run 1 to 1 ½ hours.

Q: What will we be studying in the campaign?

A: We will use three books: 1) A Firm Foundation, published by the Wesley Covenant Association. 2) Simple Church: Returning to God's Process for Making Disciples, by Thom S. Rainer and Eric Geiger (B&H Books, June, 2011); and 3) The Class Meeting: Reclaiming a Forgotten (and Essential) Small Group Experience, by Kevin Watson (Seedbed, 2013).

Q: Why are we using the other two books?

A: We will study the first three chapters of Simple Church to get our hearts around one concept: That we need to simplify and focus on the one most important thing: our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We will study *The Class Meeting* to learn how the Methodist Movement was so successful in its beginnings by using the now-missing and essential small group experience which the early Methodists called 'The Class Meeting.'

Q: How long will this Small Group Campaign run?

A: 13 weeks, from the week of September 9 through the week of December 9.

Q: Will every group begin on Sunday, September 9?

A: The first groups will meet on Sunday, September 9, but every group meeting that week will cover the same material, regardless of the day upon which it meets.

Q: If I sign up for a group, will the leaders contact me to give the meeting location? A: Where necessary, group leaders will be in contact about the meeting location. For meetings at the church, it is your responsibility to find the location for your small group. Locations of each group will be prominently displayed on Sunday, September 9.

Q: How do I get the books for the small group campaign?

A: Group leaders will have the books at the first meeting. Books can also be picked up at the church office earlier if desired. A suggested donation of \$20/book set is due on pickup.

Q: If you miss a Small Group meeting, can you sit in on another small group to make it up? A: Yes, you are welcome in other groups. Although we hope members will remain in their own group to build relationships, every group will cover the same content each week, so joining another temporarily to cover missed material is fine.

Q: Is this Campaign a Bible Study?

A: The small group campaign is not a "Bible study" per se, but the Bible will be upheld during the campaign as the final authority for matters of faith and practice.

Q: Will the small group discussions involve politics or theological debate?

A: The purpose of the small groups is to help us grow as disciples of Jesus Christ and to prepare for a vibrant new Methodist future. The campaign has no direct bearing on the politics of our nation, so secular political discussion is irrelevant. The politics of the church is another matter. Small group discussions may cover all manner of theological issues related to the current culture and setting of our church and denomination.

Q: Will the children and youth be part of this small group campaign?

First UMC September 2018

A: Youth (confirmed and older) will be part of the campaign studying the same material on Sunday morning. Children K-7 are not part of the campaign but will be studying discipleship in their Sunday School Classrooms.

- Q: If you are in a Small Group that meets during the week, is there anything different being offered during the Sunday School hour on Sunday morning?
 - A: We are working on a group that may meet in Fellowship Hall during Sunday school. It may involve open discussion about the week's themes.
- Q: If visitors come to worship on Sunday morning, can we invite them to our small group? A: YES! Please do! Groups are open, and visitors should be welcomed. You can personally invite the visitor who is sitting near you to join your group. If we need to create some new groups to accommodate more people along the way, we will.
- Q: What happens when the Small Group Campaign is over in December?
 A: The Administrative Board of the church will be hosting six to eight strategic planning sessions in January and February 2019 to create a new long-range discipleship plan for the church. All faithful campaign participants will be invited to help create the plan.
- Q: What does 'faithful participation in the campaign' mean?
 - A: 'Faithful participation' means 2/3rds attendance, or attendance at 9 out of 13 sessions.
- Q: Why is the Administrative Board asking everyone to participate in the campaign if they want to be part of the Strategic Planning Process in 2019?
 - A: The Administrative Board has realized that to revitalize our mission, we must develop a new strategic process of discipleship at First UMC. The Board approved the small group campaign to help train both themselves and others to effectively do this planning work. Each Board member is committing to participate in the campaign. They want as much participation as possible from the congregation to create the new strategic plan. Therefore, they are asking others who want to help create the Strategic Plan to prepare themselves in the same way by also being part of the campaign. The goal is that we be unified in understanding and Spirit when we get together in the new year to do the planning work.
- Q: If I do not participate in the Small Group Campaign, will I be allowed to vote at officially called Congregational Meetings about the future of our church?
 A: Yes. According to the law of the United Methodist Church ("the Discipline"), every professing member has the right to vote if they attend an officially convened Congregational Meetings. Such meetings are convened by permission of the District Superintendent for whatever expressed purpose requires a congregational vote. We will continue to abide by the Discipline of the Church in these matters. Lack of participation in the Campaign does not affect this right.
- Q: What if I want to continue in a small group after the Campaign ends in December?
 A: We anticipate the new Discipleship Process at FUMC will include an expanded small group ministry. You will be able to find one, or we will help you create a new one.
- Q: Who will ensure that the campaign is going well and is on track?
 A: The pastor and all small group leaders will be meeting as a team periodically during the fall to ensure the campaign goes well and to address issues along the way. Questions and needs about the campaign should be funneled to them through the church office.
- Q: Where are we going with all this?
 - A: Great Question! We are moving forward to become more effective at our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ, by the grace and Spirit of God!





TAKE A BREAK CAREGIVING CONFERENCE

2018 is going fast. Already Health & Welfare is looking at 2019!

We are planning the "Take a break" Caregiving Conference to be held for Nov 7, 2019. This event is open to all caregivers, all ages, male and female. You may be or know of a home caregiver struggling with questions and looking for answers. It is still a year away but that is what this event is for – to give you a day of respite from caring for others and learn what you need to care for yourself and your care recipient.

The event will be held in our own Fellowship Hall. We are expecting 150 caregivers to register for a day of relaxing fun, information and lunch. There will be a panel of experts to answer questions. Some of our own church family are filling spaces on the panel, as speaker, and as moderator. Can't divulge names yet, but you'll recognize them when you see them.

On Sunday evening, September 23rd, at 6:30 PM, the third class of Stephen Ministry Training will begin.


STEPHEN MINISTER Over the next 7 months our Stephen Minister trainees will receive extensive training in Christian caring skills. Some of the

Sunday, October 21 is Laity Sunday. This year Doug Esposito, who works for AHEDD will be bringing some of the Youth and Young Adults with disabilities to FUMC to lead us in worship that morning. Here is a little more information on what AHEDD does:

The mission of AHEDD is to serve the community as a catalyst in the employment and development of people with disabilities. Our passion for community employment includes support for youth and adults with all types of disabilities, physical and cognitive, and those that come from diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds and varying levels of academic achievement and work experience. AHEDD has been working for over 40 years in educating and partnering with many industries in meeting the needs of both the individuals and the organizations. AHEED works with each person at their level of need, from learning to interact within the community, to developing resumes, interviewing skills, job search and development, job coaching and follow along. AHEDD works side by side with the employer to prepare an individual for the position and is available to the employer in whatever capacity required for the success of each.

Our employment approach of the 1970s was described as a "work station in industry" This approach bore resemblance to today's enclave model, where groups of individuals carry out work within a business but are not employed by the business. By the early 1980s, our model evolved to a one-on-one place and train job coaching model and we began expanding to a larger target group of people with disabilities. In 1994, our agency developed a school-to-work program focused on the transition of students with disabilities. Initially sponsored by a federal grant, the effort has continued to expand through the direct financial support of school districts.

To expose human resource personnel to our program participants and assist these job seekers in preparing for job interviews, we developed the Volunteer Interview Network of Employers (VINE) in the 1980s and were later (2000) selected to coordinate the PA Business Leadership Network (PA-BLN). The PA BLN is a business-to-business initiative that allows companies to learn about and promote the employment of persons with disabilities. In 2001, AHEDD began to contract with SSA under the Work Incentives Planning and Assistance

Program (WIPA) and Ticket to Work Program (TTW). Our participation in these programs has been an effort to address the common employment fears of SSA beneficiaries and to offer these individuals greater choice on where to get employment support.

We are looking forward to this special Sunday and the blessings that we will share together. Please join us for worship at 8:00 a.m. and 10:45 a.m.
